1. An official application for admission.
2. ACT, SAT, ASSET, or COMPASS test scores (ASSET and COMPASS tests are offered by SEARK. Contact the admissions office for information).
3. Immunization records showing proof of measles and rubella vaccines if born 1/1/57 or after.
4. Official copy of high school diploma or GED scores.
5. An official copy of college transcript if credits from another institution are to be transferred.
